


Greetings, friends and neighbors!

June 13th is National Weed Your Garden Day

June 13is *Weed Your Garden Day*. Left unchecked, weeds quickly choke out many garden flowers and vegetables. At the very least, the competition they give for sunlight, water, and nutrients causes your plants to be less productive. The purpose of this special day is to spend an extra 5-10 minutes weeding your garden.

Are you ready to participate in this special day!? Then, go out to your garden and start pulling those pesky weeds. Why is it that weeds grow more prolific than our garden flowers and vegetables? Right now, our gardens have been planted for a long enough time that weeds are growing thickly and rapidly. Weeding is a daily chore. After you complete your weeding, lay down a thick layer of mulch, to suppress the growth of new seeds.

Definition of a Weed: A weed is any plant not in a place where you want it to be. Even edible, medicinal, herbal plants, and even flowers, are weeds if you don't want them where they pop up. Dandelions are a perfect example.

How to Celebrate National Weed Your Garden Day



It is very easy to celebrate this holiday: • Go out to the garden and spend time removing weeds.

• If you have edible weeds, don't send them to the composter. Rather, make a meal of them.

• Consider using a thick layer of mulch or compost around your plants to minimize weeds. Weeding Tip: Soak the soil before weeding. It will be easier to pull the roots out.





Our Geology By Karen Burnette

Did you know that the Grand Staircase of the Colorado Plateau in Utah through Arizona means that when you are standing in Bryce National Park at 8,000 feet above sea level and looking at the hoodoos, you are actually standing at the very top of the Grand Canyon in Arizona.

The erosional and weathering patterns of all the rock formations from Bryce through Zion National Park and the Vermillion Clifffs to the bottom of the Grand Canyon have been formed by a combination of continental uplift through shifting of the tectonic plates and the running of the Colorado River.

Geologists estimate that greater than 11,000 vertical feet of rock have been carried away by the Colorado river alone. After John Wesley Powell explored the Green and Colorato Rivers through the Grand Canyon, Clarence Dutton was appointed by Mr. Powell to study the area. Mr. Dutton first named this area the Great Geologic Stairway. If you visit the South Rim of the Grand Canyon, one section of the Rim Hike has rock specimens taken from various places in the canyon. Each specimen is dated. The age of some of these rocks is amazing!
