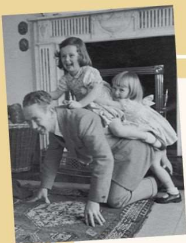

Salvador Dalí designed the Chupa Chups logo. The surrealist artist created the iconic design in 1969.




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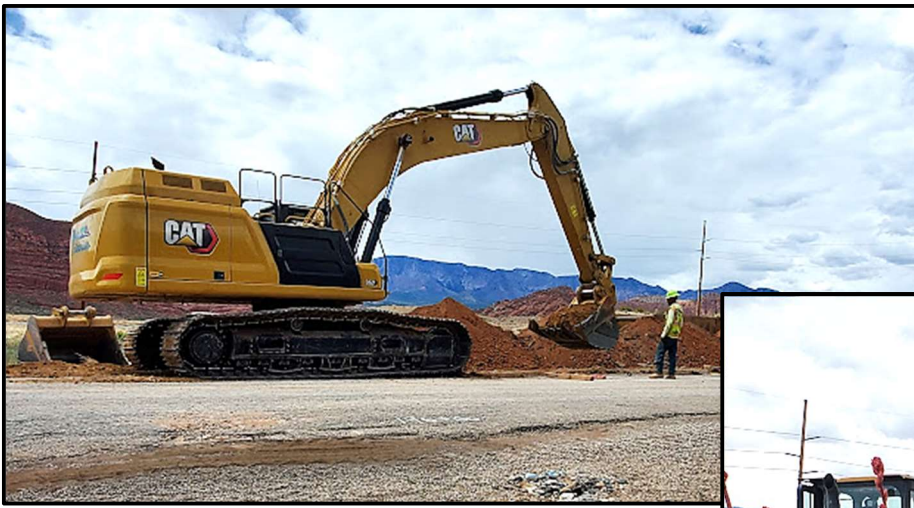

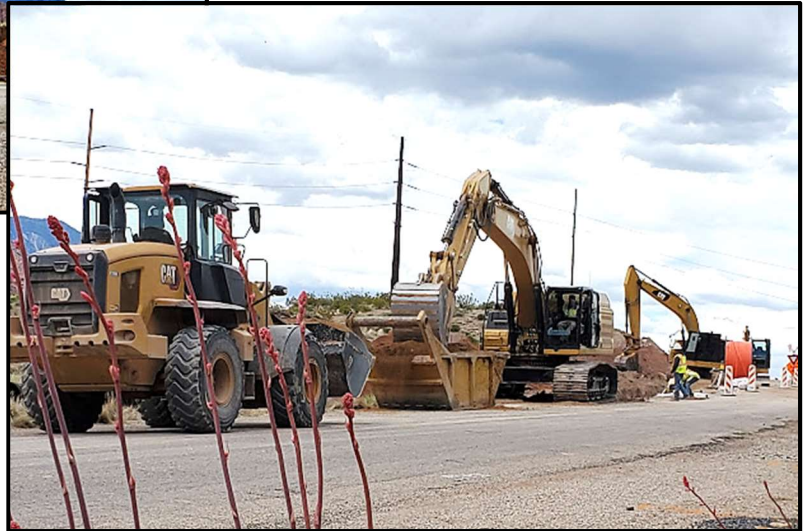

## Snickerdoodle Bread

### Ingredients

- 1 cup unsalted butter, softened
- 2 cups + 3 Tbsp. sugar divided
- 3 ½ tsp. ground cinnamon, divided
- ½ tsp. salt
- 3 eggs
- ¾ cup sour cream
- 1 tsp. vanilla extract
- 2 ½ cups all-purpose flour
- 2 tsp. baking powder
- 1 (10-ounce) package Hershey's Cinnamon Chips



### Instructions

1. Preheat the oven to 350°F. Lightly grease two large (5 x 9 inch) loaf pans with cooking spray and set aside.
2. In a large bowl, cream butter, 2 cups sugar, 2 teaspoons cinnamon, and salt until fluffy. Add eggs and mix well. Then add sour cream and vanilla and mix well.
3. Mix flour and baking powder in a separate bowl. Add to wet ingredients and mix until all combined.
4. Add cinnamon chips and stir into batter. Spoon batter evenly into the prepared loaf pans.
5. Mix the remaining 3 tablespoons of sugar and 1½ teaspoons of cinnamon in a bowl and sprinkle over the batter in each loaf pan.
6. Tent pans with foil and bake for 40-45 minutes (or until a toothpick inserted into the middle comes out clean). Let cool before removing from pan and slicing.



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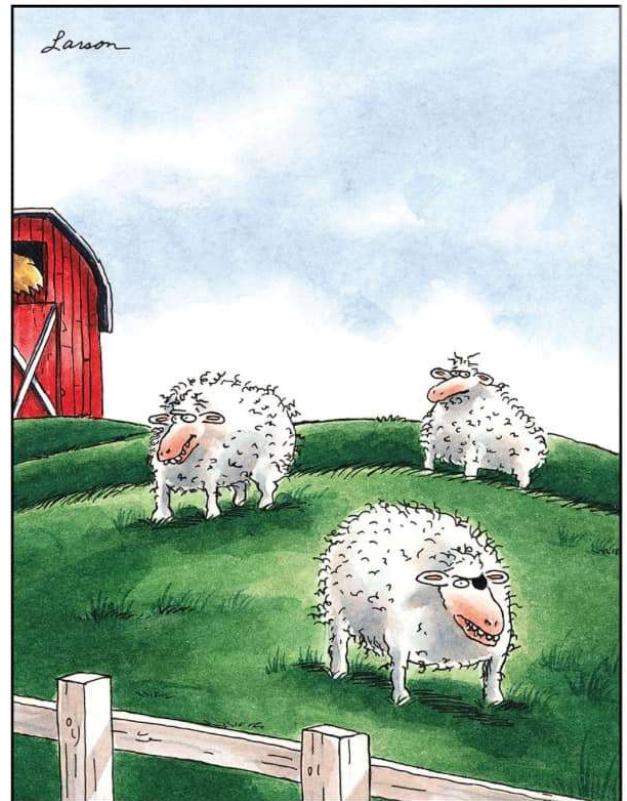
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## *June 14 is Monkey Around Day!*

How to Celebrate Monkey Around Day---Celebrate this special holiday, with just about any kind of monkey business. For example, you can:

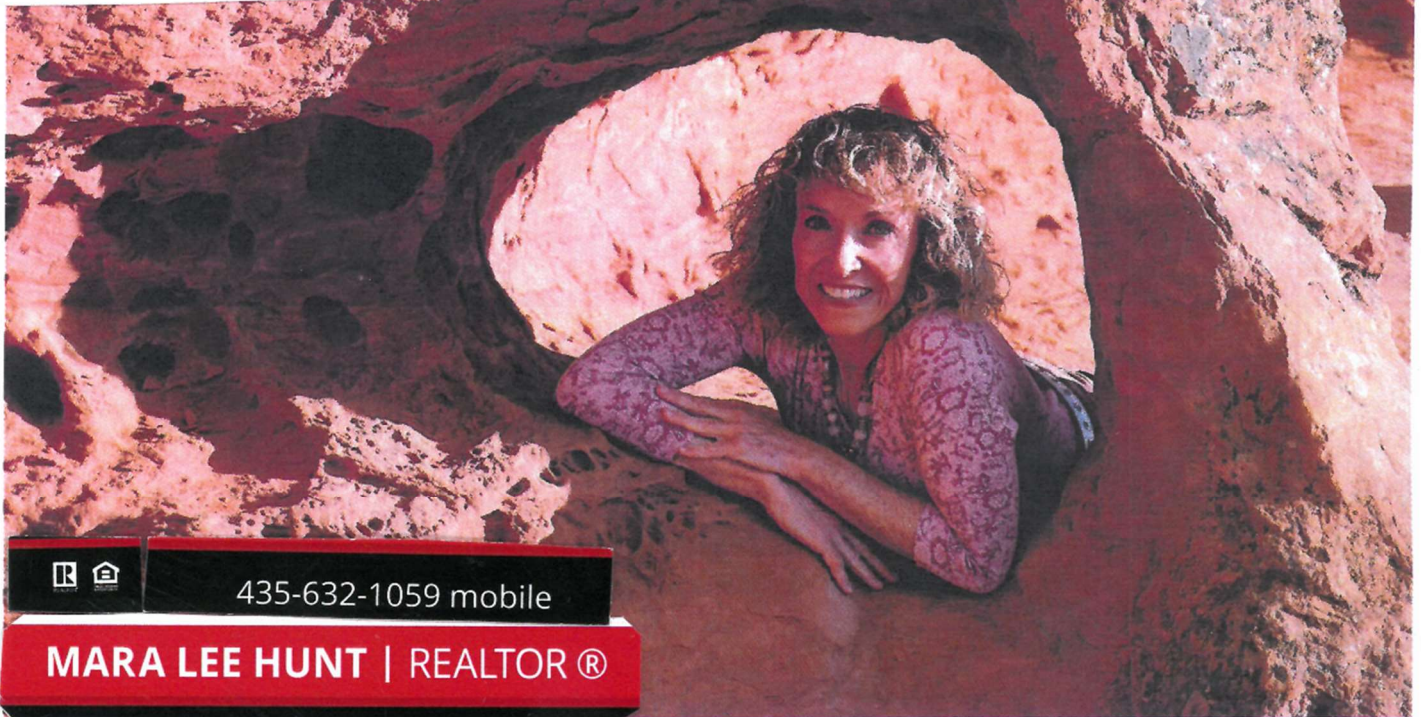
- Monkey around. I bet you can think of a number of ways to “monkey around.”

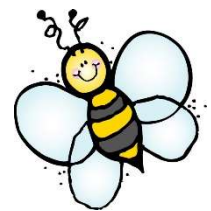
50 miles west of Delta, Utah is a U Dig site where one can go looking for trilobite fossils. This area of Utah has the richest deposits of trilobite fossils found anywhere in the world, although trilobite fossils can be found worldwide, mostly in shale deposits.

Trilobites were hard-shelled animals which lived on sea floors and reefs for millions of years during the Mesozoic era from 550 million years ago to 250 million years ago. During this period, trilobites evolved over 15,000 species, all of which are now extinct. Their sizes varied from .04 inches to 2.3 feet long. Trilobites were the first large-shelled organisms on the planet and are considered predators which fed on soft body sea creatures.

Trilobites looked like roly-polly or sow bugs and had jointed exoskeletons, 2 to 3 piece hard shells (hence the name tri-lo-bite). Trilobites shed their outer shells at least three times during their life cycles and the fossils you collect may be those shed shells embedded in shale.

Scientists classify trilobites as fossilized arthropods. Arthropods include insects, spiders, scorpions, and crustaceans. The trilobite exoskeletons were fortified with mineralized calcite, which made them more fossilizable than insects, spiders, scorpions, or crustaceans.

Trilobite images have been used by many ancient cultures in the form of amulets. Even the Ute Native Americans of Utah carved trilobite images and named them “little water bug in stone house.”

The Boot Stomp'n will be held from 7 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. at the Harmony Building at Legacy Park.

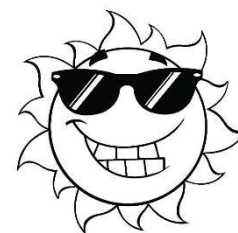
Entrance is \$10 for adults, \$5 for children ages 5-17, and free for children under five years old.
