1/2 tsp each Ginger, Cloves, Nutmeg


4-1/2 c. Flour

Chill overnight. Roll in balls & sugar. Bake 350 degrees.




Things to Do: Christmas in the Canyon



What Happened to the Dinosaurs?

The large dinosaurs we are most familiar with (T Rex, Spinosaurs, Stegosaurs, etc.) disappeared from earth 65 million years ago near the end of the Cretaceous Period. What happened? 
